Book: The Day the Crayons Quit and The Snail and the Whale.

Key Skills:

- To develop a pleasure in reading, motivation to read
- Ensure letter formation is correct and address accordingly.
- Improve our writing with noun phrases and alliteration.

National Curriculum:

- Spells most common exception words correctly.
- Add suffixes using -ing and -ed, where no change is needed in the spelling of root words.

Computing

Topic: Maze Explorers

Key Skills:

- To understand the functionality of the direction keys.
- To understand how to create and debug a set of instructions (algorithm).
- To use the additional direction keys as part of an algorithm

National Curriculum:

- Create and debug simple programs
- Use logical reasoning to predict the behaviour of simple programs.

Music

Types of music: Action songs; Teddy's day composition activity

Key skills:

- Take part in singing
- Make and control long and short sounds, using voices and instruments

National Curriculum:

- Use voices expressively
- Play tuned and untuned instruments

Numeracy

Topics: Multiples of 2, 5 and 10. Fractions.

Key Skills:

- Count in multiples of twos, fives and tens.
- Recognise, find and name a half as one of two equal parts of an object, shape or quantity.
- Recognise, find and name a quarter as one of four equal parts of an object, shape or quantity.

National Curriculum:

- Count in multiples of twos, fives and tens.
- Solve one step problems involving multiplication and division, by calculating the answer using concrete objects, pictorial representations and arrays with the support of the teacher.

Humanities (History/Geography)

Topic: The Royal Family : Compare and Contrast Elizabeth I to present day Queen Elizabeth.

Key Skills:

- Chronological understanding - Match objects to people of different ages.
- Chronological understanding - Use words and phrases such as old, new, young, days, months.
- Historical Enquiry - Find answers to simple questions about the past from sources of information e.g. artefacts, pictures, stories.
- Historical Interpretation - Use stories to encourage children to distinguish between fact and fiction.
