Book: *The Breadwinner*

Key Skills:

Reading:

- To recognise more complex themes in what they read
 - To listen to guidance and feedback on the quality of their explanations and contributions to discussions and to make improvements when participating in discussions
 - To compare characters, settings and themes within a text and across more than one text
- To analyse and evaluate the use of language, including figurative language and how it is used for effect, using technical terminology such as metaphor, simile, analogy, imagery, style and effect
- To discuss how characters change and develop through texts by drawing inferences based on indirect clues.

Writing

- To use further organisational and presentational devices to structure text and to guide the reader (e.g. headings, bullet points, underlining).
- To propose changes to vocabulary, grammar and punctuation to enhance effects and clarify meaning
- To write effectively for a range of purposes and audiences, selecting the appropriate form and drawing independently on what they have read as models for their own writing (including literary language, characterisation, structure, etc.). To distinguish between the language of speech and writing and to choose the appropriate level of formality.

Topic: *Coding*

Key Skills:

- To design programs
- use variables within a game to keep track of the properties of objects.
- use functions and understand why they are useful in 2Code.
- debug a program and organise the code into tabs.
- organise code into functions.
- explore the options for getting text input from the user in 2Code.
- use flowcharts to test and debug a program.

Humanities (History/Geography)

Topic: *Rebuilding Britain after WW2*

Key Skills:

- Understand how changes have occurred and link within and across the time periods studied
 - To understand how the past has affected the present and future.
 - To know the importance of sources and what makes it reliable and useful.
- To understand the impact the War had on Britain and the world

Science

Key Skills:

- describe how living things are classified into broad groups according to common observable characteristics and based on similarities and differences, including microorganisms, plants and animals

Key Skills: sing songs following the melody well; perform with others; learn how to create an ensemble performance; taking instructions from the leader;

Key Skills:

Maths

Topics: *Ratio and properties of shapes*

Key Skills:

- Solve problems involving the relative sizes of two quantities where missing values can be found using integer multiplication and division facts
- Solve problems involving similar shapes where the scale factor is known or can be found
- Solve problems involving unequal sharing and grouping using knowledge of fractions and multiples
- Draw 2-D shapes using given dimensions and angles
- Compare and classify geometric shapes based on their properties and sizes and find unknown angles in any triangles, quadrilaterals and regular polygons.
- Recognise angles where they meet at a point, are on a straight line, or are vertically opposite, and find missing angles.
