
Composition (Drawing) - EYFS & KSI Autumn I



Reception will learn about the composition of the face. Skills will include basic mark making, colour mixing and observational drawing.

Talking Point: Can you create art by using your imagination alone?


Composition (Drawing) -KS2 Autumn



Year 3 will learn about how to use light and shade to create different compositions. They will develop their observational drawing skills and use graphite pencils and charcoal to create cave art in 3D caves.

Year 4 will learn about still life compositions. They will use observational skills, collage and shading techniques then make choices when creating their own compositions.

Year 5 will learn how to combine words and typography in their artwork. They will experiment with a variety of media and create their own compositions.




Year 6 will learn about textile art. They use their drawing skills to design a seasonal weaving composition. They will use a variety of fabrics and materials to make and thread their own loom and create their own piece of weaving.

Reception will learn about the primary and secondary colours. They will explore colour composition using different mediums and experiment with a variety of painting tools in order to develop control.






Year 2 will learn about the shades and tones of colours and how to make colours lighter and darker. They will also look at creating mix and match colours effectively in a composition.


Composition (Painting) —KS2 Spring I



Year 3 will learn about complimentary colours and be able to work confidently in scales (big & small compositions). They will also learn about how artists use colour to enhance and direct their compositions.

In Year 4 children will look at different painting techniques. They will look at famous artworks and discuss how pointillism has evolved over time.


Talking Point: What is a craft?


Composition (Sculpture/Craft) - KS2 Summer 1


Talking Point: Was the composition of the symbols in Hieroglyphics important?
