In this final study see how the SS Empire Windrush brought the first Caribbean migrants to the UK to help rebuild Britain after the Second World War. *Since Windrush how has the view of the monarchy changed in the commonwealth?*

Here you will learn about the Atlantic slave trade or triangular trade involved the forced enslavement of many millions of Africans and their transport to the Americas, where they were made to work without wages in often inhumane conditions. *Did the monarchy benefit from the slave trade?*
